Swan Lake - Opera de Paris

A ballet in four acts by Rudolf Nureyev, after Marius Petipa and Lev Ivanov Music: Pyotr Ilyich Tchaikovsky Liberato: Vladimir Begichev and Vassili Geltser Soloists: Amandine Albisson & Mathieu Ganio Ballet of the Opera National de Paris. Drawing on ancient Slavic and Norse mythology where destiny is often born out of the mysterious forces of nature, Swan Lake has become a legend in its own right. Tchaikovsky's first ballet score is imbued with a deep sense of nostalgia, echoing the composer's own experience of love as elusive as it was impossible. However the work remained misunderstood until 1895 when Marius Petipa undertook his own choreographic interpretation. With the help of Lev Ivanov, Petipa created majestic figures for the female corps de ballet and breathed life into the swan-dancer. In Rudolf Nureyev's "Freudian" version, conceived for the Paris Opera Ballet in 1984, Prince Siegfried, manipulated by the evil Rothbart, shuns the realities of power and marriage to take refuge in dreams where a magic lake symbolizing idealised love appears to him. Nureyev elevated the role of the prince to that of the heroine by giving him a deeper psychological dimension whilst opting to give this masterly action ballet a tragic denouement more in tune with its musical substance.

Maurice Béjart, Soul of Dance

On the occasion of the 10th anniversary of his death late 2017, this film chronicles the unique destiny of this outstanding choreographer through rare archives, testimonies of his close relatives and of contemporary choreographers who were deeply influenced by his work.



This Don Juan terrifies but attracts, subjugates in desire as in terror ... Mozart sublimates the adventures of one of the most famous seducers of classical literature. Don Giovanni's appetites are limitless: a woman-eater, this powerful and casual lord defies both morality and established order, mocking religion, persifing in cemeteries, and blaspheming God himself at the fatal hour. Around him, we are busy, we get irritated, we succumb ... before returning to the ordinary of his daily life. The work is undoubtedly the most dramatic of the Mozart-Da Ponte trilogy. Frida. Viva La Vida





The film rolls out in a journey in search of Frida, into the heart of Mexico, amid cactuses, monkeys, deer and parrots, alternating exclusive interviews, with period documents, evocative reconstructions and works by Kahlo herself, including the most famous selfportraits.


Gauguin



The National Gallery, London, 90 min., English, Hebrew subtitles. This landmark cinema release opens with a 60-minute documentary about the life and work of Paul Gauguin narrated by actor Dominic West. This is followed by a 30-minute private view filmed exclusively for cinemas of the 'original and brilliant' (★★★★ Telegraph) National Gallery exhibition 'The Credit Suisse Exhibition: Gauguin Portraits'. Filmed on location in Tahiti, France, the Marquesas Islands and the UK, the documentary explores Gauguin's extraordinary – and often problematic – artistic achievement, with commentary from his descendants, contemporary artists and world experts. The film examines Gauguin's legacy not only through the lens of art history, but also those of gender and post-colonial politics, reassessing the artist's treatment of young indigenous women and his role in 19th century French colonialism.

Filmed exclusively for cinemas in high definition with stunning close-ups, the exhibition private view gives art enthusiasts the opportunity to see this first ever exhibition of Gauguin's portraits on the big screen, filmed just after it opened at the National Gallery in London in October 2019. Hosted by art historian and broadcaster Kate Bryan who welcomes the cinema audience, the engaging and insightful guided tour is led by the exhibition cocurator Christopher Riopelle, with illuminating commentary from expert contributors including painter and sculptor Maggi Hambling, and artist and writer Billy Childish.


